Hidden Words

Draw and colour a picture. Hide your spelling words inside your picture.

Show your picture to someone and see if they can find your hidden words!

Backwards Words

Write your spelling words forwards and then backwards. Write neatly!

Example: where erehw

Pyramid Writing

"Pyramid write" your spelling words. You must write neatly!

*Example: home h

ho

hom

home

Create an Activity

Can you think of a really fun way to practise your spelling words?

Then go for it!

ABC Order

First write your spelling words in a list.
Then, write each of their letters in alphabetical order:

FIRST = FIRST

WORDS = DORSW

For an extra bonus, write your words in **reverse** alpha - order!

Story, Story

Write a story using ALL of your spelling words.

Be sure to underline your spelling words in your paragraph.

Draw and Label

Draw and label your spelling words. You MUST colour your drawings and labels.

Don't forget to add a lot of great detail!

Squiggly Spelling Words

You are going to write your spelling words out twice; first, in regular, joined letter, then in squiggly letters!

Blue Vowels!

Write each of your spelling words.

You will need a blue coloured pencil. Trace over the vowels in each word with your blue coloured pencil.

(Vowels = a e i o u)

Bubble Letters Rock!

Write your spelling words in bubble letters.



Three Times!

Write each spelling word three times. First, write each word in pencil.

Second write each word in crayon.

Third, write each word in marker.
You MUST write neatly!

Acrostic Poem

Choose one of your spelling words. Write an acrostic poem for that word.

You must also ILLUSTRATE your poem.

*<u>Example</u>: Fun in the sky.

fly Laps around clouds.

Yes! I'm free!

Adding My Words Each letter has a value.

*Consonants are worth 10.

*Vowels are worth 5.

Write your spelling words. Then add up the value of each word - which is most valuable?

Example - said - 10 + 5 + 5 + 10 = 30

Superman Letter

Write a poem (it can be silly or serious) that uses all the words in your spelling list.

Can you include words you often get wrong? (AND get them right?)

Consonant Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the consonants in your words!

Vowel Circle

Write each of your spelling words.

Then go back and circle all of the vowels in your spelling words!

Don't forget to write neatly!

Buzzing Bees

Draw and colour an outdoor picture.

Count your spelling words. Draw a bee for each of your spelling words. Then write the words inside each of the "spelling" bees. Write neatly!

Goofy Spelling Story

Write a goofy spelling story using each of your spelling words.

Be sure to <u>underline</u> your words as you use them.

Illustrate and colour your story!

Riddle Me

Write a riddle for each of your spelling words.

Don't forget to add the

answers to your riddles.

*Example- I cry when I am hungry. I wearnappiess. I am cute and cuddly. What am I? *Answer-Baby


Connect the Dots

3-D Words

Use Play-Doh or clay to sculpt your spelling words.



Write your spelling words in the air using your finger.

Ask a partner to read your words as you write them

OR have a partner air write and your job is to read the words.

secret Agent Words

Number the alphabet from 1-26. Example: a=1, b=2, c=3, d=4, etc. Then convert your words to a number code. You must write the actual spelling word next to the "code word."

Back Writing

Use your finger to spell out each of your spelling words, one letter at a time, on your mum or dad's back.

Then it's YOUR turn to try to FEEL and spell!

Spell-er-size!

Pretend you are a cheerleader and call out the letters of your words!

Cheer up high for letters that touch the top handwriting line (eg. t and I), hands on hips for middle letters (eg. a and e), and cheer down low for low letters (Eg: y and j).

Choo-Choo Words


Dusty Words

Good, Clean Words

Write each of your words on two different index cards. Turn all the cards face down and mix them up.
Lay out your cards in rows (like concentration) and flip over two cards at a time. Read each card aloud to see it they match. Keep them if they match or flip over and try again!

Word Search

Write a list of your spelling words, search for them in a book of your choice - tick them off your list when you find them.

Write the title of the book you used.


Spelling Flowers

Draw a picture of a great big flower.

Each write them in a list.

Check your practice test.

Correct any errors.

Sound Words

Use a voice recorder to record yourself spelling out your words.

Then listen back to it, checking to see that you spelled all the words correctly -

How will you do this accurately?

Spelling Rounders

Draw four bases on a piece of paper or lay out four pillows to be the bases. The bowler selects a word. If the batter can spell the word correctly, he moves forward one base.

A point is earned every time you pass 4th base.

Words Without Consonants

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the consonants with a line.

Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing consonants.

Spelling Bee

Practice your spelling words in Spelling Bee style. Spell your words out loud to a buddy.

Worlds Without Vowels

Write your spelling words on a list, but replace all the vowels with a line. Then go back to the beginning of your list and see if you can fill in the correct missing vowels.

Spelling Flashcards

Make a set of flashcards to practice your spelling words. When you look at your flashcard, read the word and then spell it out loud.

**Eg.* there t-h-e-r-e.

Make Some Music

Write a song or rap that includes your words!

Share it with a class mate

Morse Code

Use Morse Code to spell your words. It is a series of dots (1 count) and dashes (3 counts). Check out this site,

http://www.morsecode.dutch.nl/alphabet.html

to see the international (NATO) Morse Code so you can practice!



Use Scrabble tiles to spell out your spelling words.

For a little extra Maths practice, figure out the point value of each of your words!



In a darkened room, use a torch to write your spelling words in the air.

Ask a partner to read your words as you write them OR your partner can "flash write" the words and your job is to read.

Delicious Words

Spray a small amount of hundreds and thousands (or anything else you can eat) on a plate and spread it out.

Write your spelling words and be sure to clean up afterwards... yummy!
